Mississippi Baptists' Complete Camping Experience

The Summer Mission Camps are for boys grades 3-12. The fee of \$165 includes snacks, crafts, lodging, activities, meals, and limited supplemental insurance. Fee is payable in full with registration form to Central Hills Baptist Retreat. Campers are asked to pay their church so that a single receipt/confirmation can be mailed to the church. Refunds will be made no later than 15 working days prior to camp date. Substitutions allowed. A parent or legal guardian is required to sign the parent's authorization section of the medical history sheet. In case of emergencies, there will be a \$20 cancellation fee.

- **Arrival time** begins at 10 a.m. in the gym each Monday. Campers should arrive no later than noon in order to participate in all activities. **Early arrivals should have parent/leader supervision until registration begins.**
- **Campers** will remain until 12:15 p.m. on Friday. There will be an awards ceremony during lunch. Parents will be able to visit with the staff. Counselors will dismiss each camper to their parent/leader at approximately 12:30 p.m. at the gym.
- **Campers** may receive only letters/cards at 6377 Attala Road 4227, West, MS, 39192-7754. Mail received after campers have left will be returned to the post office. All letters/cards should be sent by Tuesday for campers to receive before Friday.

Lad/Dad Weekends are for boys grades 5K-3 and their dads/etc. The \$85 (42.50 per person) fee is payable in full (prior to arrival) with the registration form and includes lodging, meals, activities, and limited supplemental insurance. Campers are asked to pay their church. Both Lad & Dad must complete a form. Refunds will be made no later than 15 working days prior to camp date. Substitutions allowed. A parent or legal guardian is required to sign the parent's authorization section of the medical history sheet. There is a \$5 emergency cancellation fee. Registration begins at 3 p.m. on Friday. Please arrive before 5 p.m. in order to participate in all activities. The snack/souvenir shop will be open after lunch on Saturday.

Children's Mission Camp is a three-day coed camp for grades 1-6. Cost is \$110 per camper. **Arrival time for each session (day one) is 10 a.m. and dismissal (day three) at 12:30 p.m. at the gym.** Traditional camp activities are combined with Bible study and worship for a unique camp setting. Please designate gender of campers. **Forms on campers need to be sent in one packet from the church. We request one adult chaperone for girls and one adult chaperone for boys for a total of two per church.**

CONNECT (\$165) is a 4 day camp (2 sessions) for church youth groups and their ministers. Bible study and worship combined with camp activities make a unique camp setting. **Questions/Registrations are handled through MBCB Conference Ministries Office, P.O. Box 530, Jackson, MS, 39205. Kids Camp (\$150) is the Ultimate Challenge for boys and girls who have completed grades 2-6. It's a chance for kids to get away from it all for a few days. There will be lots of fun camp stuff to do but the main focus is learning how to meet the ultimate challenge of being everything God created us to be. One counselor (of the same sex) is required for each five girls (or portion thereof) and one for each five boys (or portion thereof). **Questions/Registrations are handled through MBCB Conference Ministries Office, P.O. • **Regulations:** Our goal is for every camper to grow in knowledge and appreciation of our Lord in a fun and safe environment! They are to stay at camp unless a parent or guardian indicates otherwise. Campers are assigned to chapters by age. Campers will make new friends and learn new skills. **In keeping with these objectives-no comic books, electronics, cell phones or other distracting materials will be permitted. Also, NO firearms, pocketknives, or fireworks are permitted. The use of tobacco, alcohol, or non-prescription drugs is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.** Please do not send snacks to campers by mail; no snacks will be allowed in lodges.

• **Accommodations:** Modern lodges with central heat and air make up our lodging accommodations. All our regularly scheduled summer events use the modern lodges.

• **Health and Safety:** During summer camp, a health supervisor will be on staff and a doctor will be on call. Each camper will be provided limited "first call" insurance for injury and illness. The family's personal policy will pick up after the first call. **The medical history/health information section of the registration form must be fully completed.** At registration all campers will have their scalp checked for head lice by trained personnel. Campers found with lice will be sent home. To be eligible to return to camp the next day the camper's hair must be washed with an approved head lice shampoo and their clothes/personal items washed in hot soapy water. There will be a refund (less the \$20 cancellation fee) for campers who do not return to camp.

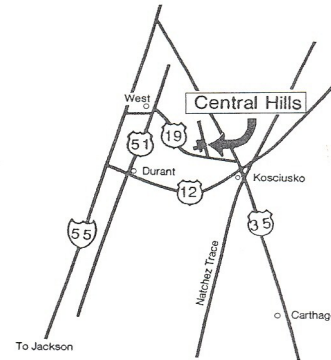

Camp Policies

- Campers are asked to remain at Central Hills for the entire camp session.
- Campers and parents are asked to cooperate with camp personnel regarding living area assignments. Campers are assigned according to age division and, if possible, according to bunk mate choice.
- The counselor will supervise and guide the chapter group as a unit at all times from registration on Monday until the camper leaves on Friday after lunch. Campers should not be absent from their chapter group at any time without the permission of their counselor.
- Campers are expected to cooperate with corrective measures deemed necessary by the counselor and/or activity instructor. Corrective measures will never involve physical contact, emotional abuse, or verbal abuse. The counselor will consult with the program director regarding any matter. When serious problems arise, they will consult with the camp manager/director.
- Campers are expected to cooperate with the counselor and the counselor's chapter mate in his/her living area. It is necessary for the campers to work together.
- When requested to do so, parents are expected to pick up a camper in the event of serious disciplinary problems.
- By signing this application, you are indicating that your child may participate in all of our activities.

The camp program is designed for him/her to participate in the following activities: handicrafts, canoeing, horseback riding, archery, riflery, swimming, ropes course, camp craft skills, and various group games.
