

- T. Lifestyle meetings – Selected homes host discussion groups for student issues and topics.
- U. The Unprogram – Enlist student to be involved in mentoring/intern relationship with student workers and/or other adults.
- V. Video Venture – Have student interview other teenagers in an opinion poll. Ask questions such as, “If you could ask God one question, what would it be?” Invite those interviewed to a showing of the videotape.
- W. Public Arena Booth – Set up a booth as a sporting event, fair, craft show, etc. Provide a free, fun activity. Or, just give a cup of cold water. Distribute tracts and information about your church.
- X. Movie Marathon – Arrange with a movie theater to show movies all night. Or, rent movies to do this.
- Y. Student Talent Show – Open to any students. Although this probably wouldn’t be limited to Christian songs, skits, etc., you may need to devise a way to be sure that the entries are appropriate.
- Z. Your own Creative Ideas – Use student leaders and students to create an idea unique to your church and community.

- A. Lock-ins, retreats.
- B. Tailgate parties.
- C. Be involved in FCA & other campus Bible/Christian clubs.
- D. S.N.A.C. - Sunday night after church.
- E. Portable Beach Party – At one location or as a traveling game.
- F. Pop in visitation – Deliver pre-popped popcorn.
- G. Homecoming Ideas – Cookies/carnations delivered to team and cheerleaders – Activities in lieu of dance (especially for younger students).
- H. Care Wash – Free wash for any student – ticket is to complete a card with pertinent information.
- I. Ten Most Wanted – List ten prospects – pray for them regularly – visit them.
- J. S Troop – Smile, serve, sow seeds – random acts of kindness, as well as planned servanthood activities.
- K. Morning outreach breakfast.
- L. One/Won/One – Commit to reach one lost friend.
- M. Sports clinics.
- N. School Video Clips – Make video at school and show at fellowship.
- O. Off campus SS/Bible Study.
- P. Your Favorite Color Night – Invite students to dress in their favorite color. Provide colorful snacks. End by presenting power band presentation or other creative gospel presentation using colors.
- Q. Christmas Caroling Add-on – Sing, leave cookies/snacks, invite students to join you. Encourage them to attend Sunday School.
- R. Judgement House – Walk-through drama, usually depicting life, death, and eternity. Often done in conjunction with Halloween.
