ORGANIZATION

The Mississippi Baptist Construction Fellowship (MBCF) is affiliated with the Men's Ministry department of the Mississippi Baptist Convention Board. The Men's Ministry Department serves as liaison with the International Mission Board/Baptist Global Relief (IMB/BGR) and the North American Mission Board (NAMB). The officers of the MBCF shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, and Project Coordinators as needed.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership in the Fellowship is open to any person who desires to associate with MBCF because of their commitment to Jesus Christ, who is a member of a Southern Baptist church, and who supports the objectives of MBCF. There are no dues.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Fellowship will be to assist state, home, and international mission work in the areas relating to construction.

The Fellowship shall provide a diversity of assistance through its resource of members. Specifically it proposes:

1. To encourage those with talents and interest in construction to help career missionaries as they work in the respective mission fields.
2. To make available a vast reservoir of skilled individuals such as architects, engineers, developers, surveyors, contractors, carpenters, electricians, suppliers, plumbers, masons, and general laborers to meet varied needs on mission fields.
3. To aid those interested in construction involvement in the selection and preparation of compatible mission assignments.
4. To assist fellowship members in a workable knowledge of general orientation and at-home preparation prior to mission involvement.
5. To relate to their churches the satisfaction of personal mission involvement.
6. To aid in the construction of needed church-related facilities that otherwise could not be completed without volunteer help.
7. To work with other Southern Baptist mission groups in accomplishing various ministries.
